2. 27/14 BEREAVEMENTS WITHIN THE COMMUNITY

There were no reported bereavements within the Community between the January and February Council meetings.

3(A). 28/14 Standing Orders were suspended:

3(B). 29/14 ATTENDANCE AT MEETING BY MR. NEAL COCKERTON (FLINTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL) AND MR. JOHN GREY (FLINTSHIRE LOCAL VOLUNTARY COUNCIL)

The Town Mayor, Councillor Mrs. L. M. Edwards, welcomed Mr. Neal Cockerton (Flintshire County Council) and Mr. John Grey (Flintshire Local Voluntary Council), to the Council meeting.

Mr. Neal Cockerton first thanked the Town Council for inviting him to the meeting. The Clerk advised that there were three items of possible transfer, namely: Bowling Club Pavilion; Football Club Pavilion; Children's Play Area. With the Bowling Club and Football Club Pavilion buildings being subject to further clarification by the Estates Department of the County Council, the only Transfer of Community Asset (ToCA) for discussion, at this stage, was the Children's Play Area.

Mr. Cockerton advised the Members in relation to the process for a Transfer of Community Asset: Firstly to complete an Expression of Interest Form (EoI); submitted applications are reviewed each month; once the EoI is accepted the County will then provide financial information in respect of the asset; the second stage is to produce a business plan and proposal in respect of the asset. Mr. John Grey referred to the assistance of the Flintshire Local Voluntary Council who are supporting Town & Community Councils, including running a number of courses. Mr. Grey advised that one of the courses related to leases, and invited the Council to take advantage of the professional advice available.

Council Members discussed the following with Mr. Cockerton and Mr. Grey: Match funding in respect of play equipment, including the £8,000.00 planning gain to upgrade play area equipment. Mr. Cockerton felt that the match funding would continue by the County, but was unaware as to the financial planning gain aspect; Would the County Council provide a one off financial payment should an asset be transferred? Mr. Cockerton advised that the County would be prepared to agree a one off payment, but there would be no further financial assistance once a lease had been signed. The lease would be for 27 years; Should any re-organisation of County Councils in Wales take place, would this affect the lease? Mr. Cockerton stated that the agreement would be legal and subsequently be transferred to any new authority; Mr. Cockerton suggested that the Council should engage with the Community, to ascertain and prioritise their views on community assets. Mr. Grey suggested that the Council evaluate the situation, and determine a balance as to what the Council can afford with any transfer of assets.

Councillor Mrs. Lynette Edwards referred to the transfer of asset in respect of the public conveniences and, in particular, to the community spirit with the running of the building. Mr. Grey asked that Councillor Mrs. Edwards share this experience at the next meeting of the Voluntary Council, and further enquired if the meeting could be held in the Memorial Institute. **Councillor Mrs. Edwards and the Members agreed to this.** Councillor Mrs. Edwards thanked both Mr. Cockerton and Mr. Grey, for attending the Town Council meeting, and for their informative presentation.

Standing Orders were restored: to enable the Council meeting to continue.

DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

There were no Declarations of Interest.

5. 32/14

TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON THE 20TH JANUARY, 2015

The Clerk referred to the following:

Minute number 2(A). 03/15 (page 1): in respect of Bereavements within the Community. The Clerk confirmed that the Reverend Chancellor D. H. Rees, had been the Priest in Charge at St. Michael's Church, and not the Rector of Caerwys.

Minute number 11(E). 20/15 (page 8): in respect of the Flintshire Local Development Plan. (See minute number 6. 33/14 - last paragraph on page 4 and first paragraph on page 5).

There were no amendments and the Minutes were proposed as correct by Councillor Howard R. Griffiths and seconded by Councillor Michael W. Moriarty and formally agreed by the Members present.

6. 33/14

MATTERS ARISING

The Clerk referred to the following matters from the previous Minutes:

Minute no: 5. 08/15 - sub Minute numbers; 5. 254/14 etc., (second paragraph) (page 3)), in respect of the Transfer of Community Assets (ToCA). The Clerk referred to the one day course that he had attended in the offices of the Flintshire Local Voluntary Council in Mold. The Clerk also referred to the Expressions of Interest forms, that had been discussed with Mr. Neal Cockerton and Mr. John Grey, during the suspension of standing orders. **(See Minute number 3(B). 29/14 on pages 1 and 2 above).** The Councillors' discussed the three items of possible transfer, namely: Bowling Club Pavilion; Football Club Pavilion; Children's Play Area. With the Bowling Club and Football Club Pavilion buildings being subject to further clarification by the Estates Department of the County Council, the only (ToCA) for discussion, at this stage, was the Children's Play Area.

Councillor David Knights referred to the committee set up by representatives of the Town Council, Memorial Institute Committee, together with a resident of the town - who were looking into the feasibility of increasing the play area equipment for the youth of the Town. Councillor Ms. Helen Priestly provided the Members with details of a recent inspection by a professional firm of play equipment suppliers. Councillor Ms Priestly hoped that by the March Council meeting, she would be in possession of a digital plan and quotation. **(See Minute number 10. 38/14 (3) on page 7).**

Councillor Jonathan Duggan-Keen proposed, that as there was a joint Committee already set up, it would be best if this Committee take the matter forward by completing an Expression of Interest form in respect of the present Children's play area. The proposal was seconded and **The Members agreed.** The Clerk advised that he would forward a copy of the Expression of Interest form to the Committee members.

Minute no: 5. 08/15 - sub Minute numbers; 5. 254/14 etc., (fifth paragraph) (page 3)), in respect of the demolition of a street light almost opposite the Memorial Institute. The Clerk advised that he had, as requested, sent copies of all the paperwork to the Council's insurers, seeking their assistance in relation to the claim against the owner of the vehicle involved with the damage. The Clerk further advised that the insurers had confirmed their acceptance of the claim, and would reimburse the Council for the cost of replacement lamp and any other charges. The claim would be subject to a £120.00 excess, which would be re-paid to the Council upon receipt from the car owner's insurance company. The Clerk also advised that the insurers had thanked him for completing all the background work in respect of the claim, which will make their investigation process far easier.

Minute no: 5. 08/15 - sub Minute numbers; 5. 254/14 etc., (sixth paragraph) (page 3)), in respect of Summerhill Farm, Caerwys. The Clerk read out an e-mail to the Members from Mr. Max Coventry, Glasfryn Hall, Caerwys, in relation to Summerhill Farm, Caerwys. Mr. Coventry was requesting that the Town Council write to JSR Farming Group, to cover the following points: the

odours seem to be less intense than before the addition of Yucca extract to the animal feed; residents have reported that the odours emanating from the pig unit seems to be much worse in the late evening than in the daytime; would JSR provide notice to the Council if the Company intends to withdraw the Yucca extract from the pig feed; bearing in mind the complaints from local residents during 2012-14 and the volume of evidence built up during that time indicating a possible statutory nuisance, the Council give notice, that they will, if necessary, under the Environmental Protection Act 1990, take action in conjunction with Flintshire County Council. **The Members agreed that the Clerk send a letter to JSR Farming Group, referring to the above.** Councillor J. Duggan-Keen offered to assist the Clerk with the drafting of the letter.

Minute no: 6(A). 09/15 (4) (page 4), in respect of the request by a resident of the town, in relation to two stiles on footpath number 1 – Caerwys through Pwllgwyn Woods to Afonwen, to be inspected by the County, with a request that the stiles be re-placed with kissing gates. The Clerk advised, that whilst a telephone call to acknowledge the letter had been received, he had received no further contact from the Rights of Way Department of the County. The Clerk advised that he would seek the assistance of the Office of the Chief Executive in securing a reply before the March Council meeting.

Minute no: 6(A). 09/15 (5) (page 5), in respect of seeking further information from the North Wales Credit Union, and in particular, as to any services presently offered to Town & Community Councils. The Clerk advised that despite two e-mails sent to an area representative and to a global e-mail address for the Union, no reply had been received. Both e-mails had not been returned, which suggested that they had been received by the recipients. **The Members agreed to take no further action.**

Minute no: 6(A). 09/15 (6) (page 5), in respect of the damaged red dog bin near to the main entrance to St. Michael's Church. The Clerk advised that the morning after the Council meeting he contacted the Street Scene Manager for the area, Mr. Andy Lightfoot, and the following day a new red dog bin was installed. Mr. Lightfoot apologised for the delay, adding that he had instructed another department to complete the work, but they had unfortunately failed to carry this out.

Minute no: 7(B). 12/15 (second paragraph) (page 6), in respect of the public notice to be placed in the Caerwys Chronicle, in relation to the precept. The Clerk read out a draft notice which had been prepared by Councillor S. G. Wilson. Following additions to the draft notice, the **Members agreed the Public Notice to be sent to the Caerwys Chronicle for publication in their next edition.**

Minute no: 9. 14/15 (page 6), in respect of Councillor J. E. Falshaw's report. The Clerk provided the Members with further information in relation to the following: **(b)** The County Council Highways Department had confirmed, that the speed reduction proposals for the A541 in Afonwen are currently with their legal section, who are preparing the paperwork for the formal advertising in the press and on site; **(d)** Councillor Howard Griffiths provided the Members with an update to the water leakage in Chapel Street. Councillor Griffiths advised that whilst further inspecting the area of the leak, he was approached by an official from Welsh Water. The official using detection equipment identified a leak, but felt that it was not from a mains water pipe. Councillor Falshaw agreed to contact the Street Scene Supervisor for the area, to seek further investigatory work.

Minute no: 11(C). 18.15 (1) (page 7), in respect of planning application number 053087, at Whitegates, Coed Farm Lane, Caerwys. The Clerk advised that an e-mail and attachments received from a neighbouring property, who objected to the application, had been forwarded to the Planning Department.

Minute no: 11(E). 20/15 (page 8), in respect of the Flintshire Local Development Plan - Candidate Sites within the Caerwys Town Council Boundary. The Clerk advised that further

information received from the planning department stated the following: The County are currently working to publish a complete county register of all candidate sites, but it was stressed that the register is not a public consultation exercise and the County will not accept any representations by the general public. Town and Community Councils as a representative body are allowed to make representations. The Clerk re-iterated to the Members, that the Planning Department had advised that a Planning Officer would be available to attend a meeting of the Town Council, to discuss the candidate sites. **The Members agreed to ask a Planning Officer to attend the March Council meeting, and for the meeting to begin at 7.00pm.**

Minute no: 14. 23/15 (page 9), in respect of the application for financial assistance made by the Flintshire Disability Forum. The Clerk advised that he had written to the Group seeking confirmation that any financial support will benefit the residents of the Community of Caerwys. The Clerk further advised that no reply had been received. **The Members agreed to place the application on file.**

7(A). 34/14

CORRESPONDENCE

The following correspondence had been received, that was required to be either advised to, or dealt with by the Members:

- (1) The Clerk advised the Members of a recently published consultation White Paper by the Welsh Assembly Government (WAG) named, Reforming Local Government: Power to Local People. The Clerk further advised that the White Paper contained proposals for the future of Town and Community Councils in Wales. The closing date for responses is the 28th April, 2015. The Clerk suggested the following to the Members: **(a)** the Clerk forward a copy of the link by e-mail to enable the Members to view the consultation document, and for the Members to make any comments personally, as either a Councillor or member of the public **(b)** the matter be placed on the Agenda for the March Council meeting, whereby the Council Members could collectively agree the responses to the document on behalf of the Town Council. **The Members agreed.**
- (2) Report from PCSO Carol Richards, who advised that there had been no recorded incidents within the Caerwys Town Council area, between the January and February meetings.
- (3) Flintshire County Council Summer Play Scheme for 2015. The Clerk advised that the cost of the scheme this year would be £900.00 (an increase of £1.80 from the 2014 scheme). The playscheme would commence on Monday 20th July for a three week period, and to be held on the Memorial Institute field. **The Members confirmed their agreement to fund the 2015 Play Scheme programme.**
The Clerk further advised that the County Council, in preparation for the potential loss of funding for the 2016 Summer Play Scheme, were suggesting that Town & Community Councils consider setting up a ‘working group’ to discuss the way forward from 2016.
- (4) The Clerk referred to the Clwydian Range & Dee Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty Partnership Association, and in particular, the e-mail that the Clerk had forwarded to all Members, seeking new members to the partnership.
- (5) The Clerk referred to a letter from the North Wales Police, inviting representatives to a meeting of the South Flintshire Police Consultation Committee, on Wednesday 4th March. Councillor M. Moriarty advised that due to a prior commitment he was unable to attend. Councillor J. Duggan-Keen, advised that at this time, he was unable to confirm his attendance.

- (6) The Clerk advised of a change of venue for the Flintshire County Forum meeting due to be held on the 26th February, at 6.30pm. The new venue for the meeting was the Alyn & Deeside room at County Hall, Mold. Councillor M. Moriarty confirmed his attendance at the meeting.
- (7) The 2015-16 membership application had been received from One Voice Wales, at a 50% reduced cost from the full fee of £164.00 (£82.00). **Members agreed not to join.**

The following correspondence was taken as received:

- (a) Notice of meeting - North & Mid Wales Association of Local Councils, on the 23rd January, 2015. The Clerk confirmed that the papers had been provided to Councillor J. A. G. Webb.
- (b) Kidney Wales Foundation. Walk for Life 2015 information.

7(B). 35/14

CLERK'S REPORT

The Clerk advised the Members of the following:

- (1) Complaint from a resident of the town, in relation to the deposit of slurry on the Pen Y Cefn road from the area of the Golf Club entrance, travelling past the main entrance to St. Michael's Church. The slurry was alleged to have been released due to the tap of a tanker not being secured adequately, thus spreading a copious amount of slurry on the road, together with an unacceptable aroma. The Clerk advised that Councillor J. Falshaw had contacted the Street Scene Supervisor for the area, and action was taken to clear the spillage by the owners of Summerhill Farm.
- (2) The Clerk had received a complaint in respect of a tree that had blown down near to the Maes Y Goron Community Centre. The Clerk advised that Councillor J. Falshaw had taken the matter forward with the County Council, who had cleared the area of tree branches.
- (3) The Clerk advised the Members that he had deposited the following into the Council's bank account. Two cheques from Dyserth & Halkyn Community Councils, for the sum of £61.33 each, towards the one third share in respect of the photocopier hire fee. The total cost of the photocopier hire fee was £184.00 per year (with the VAT of £36.80 paid by the Caerwys Town Council - which would be re-claimed).
- (4) The Clerk advised the Members that Mr. Murray Taylor, a resident of the Town, a Jeweller and Silversmith, had kindly completed a valuation for insurance purposes of the Mayor's Regalia, together with the Mayoress' silver locket and chain. The Clerk further advised that the Mayor's Regalia was now valued at £18,000.00, with the Mayoress' silver locket and chain valued at £480.00. **The Members thanked Mr. Taylor for his valuations, and asked that the Clerk advise the Council's Insurers of the new valuation details.**

TOWN MAYOR'S REPORT

The Town Mayor Councillor Mrs. Lynette M. Edwards advised the Members that no invitations had been received between the January and February meetings.

9. 37/14

COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

Councillor J. E. Falshaw as County Councillor, advised the Members in respect of the following:

- (a) Complaint in relation to dog fouling in Caerwys High Street. Councillor Falshaw had reported the matter to the County Dog Warden.
- (b) The County Council have agreed to supply a new red dog bin, to be sited on or near to the Town Square. After discussion, the Members agreed that the bin should be sited at the edge of the Bridleway (Coed Farm Lane) and near to the salt bin.
- (c) The pot holes in the areas of Lon Y Porthmyn and Holywell Road have been repaired.

10. 38/14

REPRESENTATIVES / LIAISON COMMITTEE REPORTS

- (1) Councillor David Knights reported in relation to the Caerwys Youth Club. Councillor Knights thanked those Town Councillors who sit on the Youth Club Committee. At a recent meeting of this committee, it was pleasing to report that 14 youth members of the club attended the meeting, whereby they were all invited to speak. Following the departure of the youth club leader, the club is presently being run by temporary staff provided by the County Council. The behaviour of the youth members at the club has been exemplary over the past few months, and hopefully they will now take more interest.
- (2) Councillor Ms. Helen Priestly reported in her capacity as the Council's School Governor representative at Ysgol Yr Esgob Primary School. Councillor Ms. Priestly advised the Members that the School had received a yellow rating, in the County School League Table. Councillor Ms. Priestly asked that the Council send a letter to the Head Teacher, congratulating the School and staff on achieving the rating. **The Members agreed and asked that the Clerk send an appropriate letter.**
- (3) Councillor Ms. Helen Priestly reported to the Members, in relation to the sub-committee set up to explore the feasibility of increasing the play area equipment for the youth of the Town. Councillor Ms. Priestly further referred to the recent inspection by a professional firm of play equipment suppliers. Councillor Ms Priestly reiterated, that she hoped by the March Council meeting, she would be in possession of a digital plan and quotation. **(See Minute number 6.33/14 - second paragraph under this Minute on page 3 above).**

11(A). 39/14

PLANNING APPLICATIONS

The following planning applications were dealt with by the Members at the meeting:

- (1) Application number: 053137, for the erection of stone boundary wall to front of former Candle Factory building, stone and wrought iron railings boundary to front of Henllys and retention of two sets of gates and posts, at Old Court, High Street, Caerwys.

Comments by Council: These are the second submitted applications for similar proposals, the first submissions being dealt with by Caerwys Town Council in July 2008. (PAs 042456 & 042473 refer). At that time, and still relevant to the current applications, the gates and gateposts had already been erected and formed the retrospective application for planning consent. It is assumed that these previous applications were withdrawn at some later stage as no further information was received as to any decision being made to grant planning consent and both applications removed from FCC's website.

With regard to the current applications, Caerwys Town Council is unable to support the proposal for the erection of a stone wall with railings to the front of Henllys and the attached 'Candle Factory' for the following reasons:

1. Henllys (Old Court) with the attached ‘Candle Factory’ is a Listed Building: Grade II*. Such a grading indicates that it is a particularly important building of more than special interest. Henllys was remodelled or rebuilt between 1420-1480, (15th Century), when purchased by the Mostyn family. Manorial Courts were held there by the Mostyns and then later used to hold the Assizes for Flintshire until the second half of the 17th Century, with Justices/Magistrates Courts sitting there until 1869. The 1871 Census records the building as then being a public house called ‘The Cross Foxes’, only becoming a private residence in the 20th Century. Henllys has been a public building since the late medieval period, with its forecourt never ‘privatised’ by the addition of any boundary.
2. Editions of 1 : 2500 scale OS maps published respectively in 1871, 1899, 1913, 1964, 1987 and 1991-1994 do not indicate any defined boundary at the front of Henllys or the ‘Candle Factory’. Inspection of these map editions do, however, indicate constructed boundaries for other properties located in High Street. Further, photographs dating from 1875 likewise fail to show any wall/fencing/railings in front of the buildings subject of these applications. They do reveal though that the frontage of both Henllys and the ‘Candle Factory’ formed part of the highway without let or hindrance.
3. The proposed boundary wall and railings will incorporate part of the public footpath that has been maintained by the current and previous Local Authorities for numerous decades, with unrestricted usage by pedestrians being made. The only part that is not surfaced is a narrow gravelled strip that runs along the front wall of just Henllys and extends some 9 inches out from the front pillars of the building’s porch. It is noted that this area is erroneously referred to as a ‘grassed area’ in the submitted ‘Existing Plan A3’ and within the Design & Access Statement. During the growing season this is luxuriant in weeds that have probably misled those preparing the documentation.
4. The proposed boundary wall with its railings will change the entire character and appearance of the High Street, which lies within the Caerwys Town Conservation Area, and fail to preserve its established historic setting known by all for future generations.

(2) Application number: 053138, for Listed Building application for the erection of stone boundary wall to front of former Candle Factory building, stone and wrought iron railings boundary to front of Henllys and retention of two sets of gates and posts, at Old Court, High Street, Caerwys.

Comments by Council: As per comments in planning application number 053137 above.

(3) Application number: 053207, for notification to fell 1no. Conifer within Caerwys Conservation Area, at The Beeches, South Street, Caerwys.

Comments by Council: To support the application.

(4) Application number: 053200, for the subdivision of existing dwelling into 2no. dwellings and erection of conservatory to the rear, at Pioneer Cottage, South Street, Caerwys.

Comments by Council: Caerwys Town Council supports the sub-division of the building and erection of a conservatory, but opposes the proposal of a shared parking area that only accommodates 2 vehicles, positioned in tandem, on the drive to the south of the property. This is a recipe for neighbour conflict and will also result in yet more on-street parking on the B5122, South Street, Caerwys; the main highway through the town and linking the A55 with the A541.

South Street is already a congested area through on-street parking due to the majority of dwellings in the area lacking any facility to park off-road. Parking of further vehicles will only exacerbate the existing situation.

It is requested that the applicant gives consideration to the creation of parking areas to the **rear** of both proposed units; (2 vehicles per 2/3 bedroom residential unit are suggested in Flintshire's adopted UDP Policy AC12 – Parking Provision and New Development), to overcome the issue of additional vehicles making use of South Street for parking. Looking at the site plan this is considered a feasible alternative to what is being proposed.

11(B). 40/14 PLANNING DECISIONS

The following planning decision has been received from Flintshire County Council;

- (a) Application number: 051826, at Ty Coch, Crossways Road, Pen Y Cefn. Refused.

11(C). 41/14

Councillor M. W. Moriarty advised the Members, in relation to two planning applications received by Flintshire County Council Planning Department, that had not been forwarded to the Caerwys Town Council seeking their observations. The County Planning Department had also failed to notify the Town Council of their decisions in respect of the applications. The applications related to the following:

- (a) Planning application number 053135, for the approval of details reserved by condition 19 (contamination) attached to planning permission ref: 052169 Summerhill Farm, Lon Y Porthmyn, Caerwys. The application was refused on the 21st January, 2015.
- (b) Planning application number 053089, for the approval of details reserved by condition 4 (wooden gate) attached to planning permission ref: 052414 Bim's Kitchen Ltd, Pwllgwyn Hotel, Afonwen. The application was approved on the 21st January, 2015.

The Members agreed the following: That the Clerk write to the Chief Officer (Planning & Environment), expressing the surprise of the Council, in respect of the lack of consultation, in particular, as the Town Council are a consultee on planning applications within their Community area. The Clerk to also request an assurance that there will be no further failure to consult with the Town Council in the future.

12. 42/14 COMMUNITY LIGHTING

The following lamps have been reported out of order since the last meeting:

- (a) Lamp: Opposite the entrance to The Old Rectory, Pen Y Cefn Road, Caerwys.
- (b) Lamp: Opposite Ffoulkes Terrace, Afonwen.
- (c) Lamp: Victorian style lamp on Caerwys Town Square.

The Council Members enquired in relation to the below lamps numbered 1 to 4, that have been reported out of order previously, and are still out of order. Whereas other lamps have been repaired, that were reported faulty prior to the below four:

- (1) Caerwys Town Square Bus Shelter
- (2) On wall of Talking Heads Hairdressing Salon, South Street, Caerwys.
- (3) Second light in from Mold, on the A541 in Afonwen.

(4) Last light on the A541 passed the Pwllgwyn in Afonwen, going towards Denbigh.

The Members agreed the following: That the Clerk contact the Council street lighting repair company, seeking the present position in respect of the outstanding faulty lights. The Clerk to also enquire if the new lighting column which has been erected across the road from the Institute (to replace the damaged column), is awaiting Scottish Power to connect the electricity supply.
